

## **Labour Market Information**

Labour Market Information (LMI) is information about what is happening in a labour market in a particular (usually local) area. LMI tends to focus on the industries that are growing and declining. It provides information about the types and levels of jobs and the skills required and whether they are increasing or decreasing.

LMI is essential for us, as educators, to be aware of so that we can offer courses which provide opportunities to progress into relevant career areas, alongside the support to enable this. LMI is useful for students and parents to be aware of so that it is clear what types of jobs are available in the local area, or area that they would like to move to, so that the correct choices can be made for post 16 education and beyond.

## Using this information in school

We work with a Local Enterprise Partner (LEP) via the West Yorkshire Combined Authority who assists us in sourcing the most relevant opportunities for our students to participate in. Students are given LMI in a variety of different ways:

- Assemblies during careers weeks, which occur twice a year, are focussed on different careers
  aspects and provide information surrounding LMI in areas such as sustainable industries and
  emerging technologies locally.
- All Y9 students who are making their options choices have a 1-1 interview with a member of SLT. This includes a discussion and advice around their potential career plans and pathways that are available in local providers, and beyond, where necessary, in order to realise these plans.
- All Y9, 10 and 11 students attend an annual Careers Fair, in which local sixth forms, further education colleges, training providers, apprenticeship providers and employers provide information surrounding opportunities available in the area.
- All Y10 students have a 1-1 careers interview with our Careers Advisor in which they make post-16 plans and discuss LMI in relation to these.
