A message from the Headteacher

As we come to the end of this academic year, I have spent time reflecting upon how our school community has coped with the challenges of the last two years. Last July, lessons were still undertaken in bubbles, with teaching staff moving around the school, all wearing face coverings and living in a very difficult world. We were making plans for a full reopening in September, faced with the reality that our Year 7 and 8 students had no experience of moving around our school and that our Y9 students had experienced this for only a few months whilst in Y7, all of our children and staff had worked through remote learning, isolation periods and the Teacher Assessed Grades in place of external GCSEs. The big question was, how would the school community ever return to being a vibrant and thriving community?

I write this introduction with immense relief, it is impossible to express how proud I am of our school community as a whole. We have faced significant challenges along the way, but we have remained true to our core values and it is clear that every member of our school community has tried to follow our core principals of "trying our best, being kind and following the rules". I hope that you enjoy reading about the successes that we have experienced this year. 


LEAVERS' PROM

The BBQ and bar proved very popular, providing invaluable energy for the sporting events including tug of war.




The highlight of the event were the choir performances. The choir comprised primary schools who had joined us for a day of rehearsals and performing arts masterclasses, culminating in their performances.
